

FYI: Planting Window Boxes

- Be sure your box has drainage holes. If there are no holes, drill them.
- Since boxes are small, it's best to use **fresh potting mix** every year.
- Mix equal parts of **time-release fertilizer and Plant-tone** into the potting mix before planting. For a 36" long box, use 1/3 cup of each.
- Decide on how tall you want the plants in your boxes to grow, and choose your varieties according to height as well as color.
- **Plant hanging/trailing plants in the front** of the box. In a small box (18 to 24 inches long) use one in the center. In boxes that are 30 inches or longer, use one in the center and one on each end.
- Plant mounding plants in the center of the box, & taller varieties in the back.
- **Trailing plants for sun:** *Scaevola, Petunias, Mecardonia* Gold Dust, Snow Princess *Lobularia*, ivy, variegated *Vinca*, sweet potato vine, trailing *Verbena*, licorice vine, *Dichondra* Silver Falls, *Mandevilla*, black-eyed Susan vine, trailing geraniums. **Plants for shade:** cascading *Begonia*, *Lobelia*, sweet potato vine, cascading Coleus, Algerian ivy, *Asparagus* fern, *Impatiens*, trailing *Fuchsia*.
- Mounding plants for sun: Profusion Zinna, Bidens, Cuphea, short Dahlias, zonal geraniums, Euphorbia Diamond Frost, Berried Treasure strawberries, New Guinea Impatiens, Pentas, mounding Petunias, Plectranthus, Sanvitalia, Heliotrope.
 Mounding plants for shade: Impatiens, upright Begonia, Caladium, Browalia, Coleus, Lamium.
- Taller accent plants for sun: *Juncus*/rushes, *Salvia*, *Gaura*, *Gomphrena*, *Dracaena*, *Angelonia*, Gartenmeister *Fuchsia*, gold *Duranta*. Taller accent plants for shade: Persian shield, tall *Coleus*, upright *Fuchsia*, *Dracaena*, *Duranta*.
- Use colors you love, and aim for some that contrast and others that repeat. For example, you might use two shades of purple, a light and a dark pink, (repetition) and a lime or silver foliage to contrast with those colors.
- After placing the plants in the box, **water** well and then fill in any spaces that appear with more potting mix. Water the boxes well when the soil starts to dry.
